

Performance during April, 2013

- (i) Commission advised issuance of sanction for prosecution in respect of **7** officials of various Ministries/Departments/ Organizations during the month which include an Assistant General Manager of Oriental Bank of Commerce.
- (ii) Prosecution sanctions were issued by the Competent Authorities in respect of **11** officials of various Ministries/Departments/ Organizations during the month which include an Assistant Commissioner of Central Board of Excise & Customs and a Deputy Secretary of Ministry of Home Affairs.
- (iii) Commission processed **2973** complaints (including **27** whistle blower complaints) during the month and sought investigation/factual report in **127** complaints from the concerned Ministries/Departments/Organizations.
- (iv) Commission advised initiation of major penalty proceedings against **111** officials of various Ministries/Departments/Organizations which include an Executive Director of Indian Oil Corpn. Ltd., a General Manager from Syndicate Bank, a Commissioner of Income Tax, two Superintending Engineers from Delhi Development Authority, a General Manager (HR) from Indraprastha Power Generation Co. Ltd., a General Manager (Mining) from Central Coalfields Ltd., a General Manager from South Eastern Coalfields Ltd. and a General Manager from Hindustan Aeronautics Ltd.
- (v) Commission advised imposition of major penalty against **40** officials of various Ministries/Departments/Organizations, which include three General Managers from Airports Authority of India and one General Manager from Bharat Coking Coal Ltd.
- (vi) On the advice of the Commission, the Competent Authorities imposed major penalties in respect of **115** officials of various Ministries/Departments/Organizations, which include an Executive Director of HMT Ltd., a General Manager of Syndicate Bank, a General Manager (Marketing) of The State Trading Corporation of India, a General Manager of Central Coalfields Ltd. and a Chief Medical Officer of New Delhi Municipal Council (NDMC).
- (vii) Intensive Examination of 7 works were carried out by Chief Technical Examiner's Organization resulted in recoveries to the tune of Rs. 1,07,34,852/- during April, 2013.
- (viii) Commission provided inputs in respect of **8** matters for vigilance clearance of officials for Board level appointments in CPSE's. In addition, references of **72** All India Services and Central Services officers were considered for vigilance clearance in matters of empanelment, promotion etc. and inputs provided by the Commission.
- (ix) **6** officers were considered for appointment/empanelment as full time CVOs in various organizations and recommendations were given by the Commission.

B. Important activities:

- (i) Central Vigilance Commission organized the Executive Committee Meeting of International Association of Anti-Corruption Authorities (IAACA) from 8th -10th April, 2013 at New Delhi. The Conference was inaugurated by Hon'ble Minister, Shri V. Narayanasamy, Minister of State, Prime Minister Office (PMO) and Minister of State (Personnel and Public Grievances). CVC, on behalf of India is leading a 10 member task force on Knowledge Management. A meeting of the task force was also held on the side lines of the Conference.

- (ii) A training course for newly inducted CVOs was conducted by the Commission in April, 2013. About 29 CVOs from PSUs, Banks and other major organizations attended the five days training course. The course schedule consisted of various matters related to vigilance administration and anti-corruption strategies including investigation techniques and criminal action procedures etc.

- (iii) During the month, the Commission convened three Annual Zonal/Sectoral Review Meetings with the Chief Executives/CMDs and Chief Vigilance Officers of the Aviation, Transport & Tourism Sector on 18.4.2013, Financial Sector on 23.4.2013 and Social Sector on 26.4.2013. During the review meetings, the Commission emphasized to the participating Departments/Organizations on various aspects of vigilance administration for transparency and accountability in the activities like undertaking systemic improvements, Leveraging of Technology through e-procurement, reverse auctions etc. The Commission also underscored the need for updation of Manuals, sensitization of officials by conducting training programmes, effecting rotational transfer of officials, Scrutiny of annual property returns etc. Further, matters pertaining to pendency of complaints/cases, delay in processing of vigilance cases and cases pertaining to sanction of prosecution etc. were also reviewed by the Commission.
