

## Performance during November, 2014

- (i) Commission advised issuance of sanction for prosecution in respect of **10** officials of various Ministries/Departments/Organizations during the month which include an IAS officer i.e. the then CEO of Siliguri Jalpaiguri Development Authority, West Bengal, an IRS officer from Central Board of Direct Taxes and a Deputy Director General from Department of Telecommunications.
- (ii) Prosecution sanctions were issued by the Competent Authorities in respect of **7** officials of various Ministries/Departments/ Organizations during the month which include an IFS Officer of Ministry of Environment & Forests and an IPS officer from Ministry of Home Affairs.
- (iii) Commission advised initiation of major penalty proceedings against **130** officials of various Ministries/Departments/Organizations which include a Deputy Managing Director of State Bank of India, two IRS officers from Central Board of Direct Taxes, a Deputy Director General of Department of Telecommunications, a Commissioner of Central Board of Excise & Customs, two General Managers from Industrial Development Bank of India, a General Manager (Retd.) from Punjab & Sind Bank, an Executive Director(PLNG) of Airports Authority of India, a General Manager of Pawan Hans Helicopters Ltd. and a General Manager from Hindustan Petroleum Corporation Ltd.
- (iv) Commission advised imposition of major penalty against **43** officials of various Ministries/Departments/Organizations, which include two Directors and two Principal Scientists from Indian Council of Agricultural Research and an Executive Director of Konkan Railway Corporation Ltd.
- (v) On the advice of the Commission, the Competent Authorities imposed major penalties in respect of **74** officials of various Ministries/Departments/ Organizations, which include two General Managers from Syndicate Bank, a General Manager of Bank of India and a General Manager (Retd.) from Indian Bank.
- (vi) Commission processed **5824** complaints (including **54** whistle blower complaints) during the month and sought investigation/factual report in **89** complaints from the concerned Ministries/Departments/Organizations.
- (vii) Intensive Examination of **08** works carried out by Chief Technical Examiner's Organization resulted in recoveries to the tune of **₹ 500.41 lakhs** during November, 2014.
- (viii) Commission provided inputs in respect of **47** cases for vigilance clearance of officials for Board level appointments in CPSE's. In addition, references of **530** officials of All India Services and Central Services were considered for vigilance clearance in matters of empanelment, promotion etc. and inputs provided by the Commission.
- (ix) **31** officers were considered for appointment/empanelment as full time/part time CVOs in various organizations and recommendations were given by the Commission.
