

Performance during April, 2016

- (i) Commission advised issuance of sanction for prosecution in respect of **7** officials of various Ministries/Departments/Organizations.
- (ii) Prosecution sanctions were issued by the Competent Authorities in respect of **9** officials of various Ministries/Departments/Organizations.
- (iii) Commission advised initiation of major penalty proceedings against **68** officials of various Ministries/Departments/Organizations.
- (iv) Commission advised imposition of major penalty against **12** officials of various Ministries/Departments/Organization.
- (v) On the advice of the Commission, the Competent Authorities imposed major penalties in respect of **71** officials of various Ministries/Departments/ Organizations.
- (vi) Commission processed **12819** complaints (including **89** whistle blower complaints) during the month and sought investigation report in **36** complaints from the concerned Ministries/Departments/Organizations.
- (vii) Intensive Examination of **1** works carried out by Chief Technical Examiner's Organization resulted in recoveries to the tune of **₹ 344.75 lakhs** during April, 2016.
- (viii) Commission provided inputs in respect of **24** cases for vigilance clearance of officials for Board level appointments in CPSE's. In addition, references of **256** officials of All India Services and Central Services were considered for vigilance clearance in matters of empanelment, promotion etc. and inputs provided by the Commission.
- (ix) **7** officers were considered for appointment/empanelment as full time/part time CVOs in various organizations and recommendations were given by the Commission.

Important activities:

- (i) The Central Vigilance Commission had organized a lecture of Shri Arvind Panagariya, Vice Chairman, NITI Aayog on the topic of 'Indian Economy: Where from and Where to' on 26th April, 2016.
- (ii) Shri K.V. Chowdary, Central Vigilance Commissioner inaugurated Banker's Club of Hyderabad at the Head Office of State Bank of Hyderabad on 12th April, 2016. Speaking on the occasion, Shri Chowdary emphasized on the key role the Banker's Club could play in various facets of banking by developing uniform cross checks and clearly defining key areas that could prevent avoidable frauds.
- (iii) Shri K.V. Chowdary, Central Vigilance Commissioner attended a joint talk organized by the Public Concern for Governance Trust and the National Institute of Bank Management on 1st April, 2016 at Pune. The focus of the speakers was on how to tackle the issue of non-performing assets and the role that vigilance can play in curbing or decreasing the level of NPAs.
