

## Performance during January, 2017

- (i) Commission advised issuance of sanction for prosecution in respect of **4** officials of various Ministries/Departments/Organizations.
- (ii) Prosecution sanctions were issued by the Competent Authorities in respect of **12** officials of various Ministries/Departments/Organizations.
- (iii) Commission advised initiation of major penalty proceedings against **75** officials of various Ministries/Departments/Organizations.
- (iv) Commission advised imposition of major penalty against **6** officials of various Ministries/Departments/Organization.
- (v) On the advice of the Commission, the Competent Authorities imposed major penalties in respect of **121** officials of various Ministries/Departments/ Organizations.
- (vi) Commission processed **1575** complaints (including **43** whistle blower complaints) during the month and sought investigation report in **11** complaints from the concerned Ministries/Departments/Organizations.
- (vii) Intensive Examination of **02** works carried out by Chief Technical Examiner's Organization resulted in recoveries to the tune of **₹ 149.75 lakh** during **January, 2017**.
- (viii) Commission provided inputs in respect of **29** cases for vigilance clearance of officials for Board level appointments in CPSE's. In addition, references of **181** officials of All India Services and Central Services were considered for vigilance clearance in matters of empanelment, promotion etc. and inputs provided by the Commission.
- (ix) **11** officers were considered for appointment/empanelment as full time/part time CVOs in various organizations and recommendations were given by the Commission.

### Important activities:

- (i) Shri K.V. Chowdary, Central Vigilance Commissioner delivered an interview highlighting the steps taken by the Central Vigilance Commission to prevent corruption in Central Government and its Departments under the purview of CVC on All India Radio, Visakhapatnam on 06/01/2017.
- (ii) The Central Vigilance Commission's monthly lecture was delivered by Justice B.S. Chauhan, Chairman Law Commission of India on the topic " Fair Investigation and Trial & Disciplinary Proceedings" on 20<sup>th</sup> January, 2017.
- (iii) The Commission had organized training course for newly inducted CVOs of CPSUs, Central Departments and Autonomous Organizations of Government of India at Sardar Vallabh Bhai Patel National Police Academy, Hyderabad from 16-27<sup>th</sup> January, 2017.
